Shoes, slippers, bags, wood pieces, natural flowers, shells, disposable lighters(see the back as well.), cassette tapes, videotapes, CDs, stuffed animals, disposable diapers, and non-recyclable paper (e.g., carbon paper).
※ For paper diapers, dispose of fill in a toilet and place the diaper in a plastic bag. Put them out with burnable garbage.

※ Containers and packs with ♻️
※ Separate the above wastes as burnable garbage if food is attached to the wastes.
※ Garbage larger than the bag should go to the plastic items category.
※ Dispose of plastic bottles as "Large garbage".
※ To prevent scattering, be careful not to fly on days with strong winds.

Recyclable paper waste
Wrapping paper, paper bags, cartons, paper cans, pasteboard, and recyclable paper wastes other than paper containers and cartons (e.g., notebooks, copy paper, postcards). Paper package less than 500 ml
※ Dispose of food and odorous waste as "Burnable garbage".

Large Garbage (Twice a Month)

(Length of 2m or less, weight of less than 50 kg)

Wood items
(Break and bundle as much as possible)

Wood items (desks, chairs, beds, drawers, etc.), wood pieces, fusuma doors, items composed mainly of wood.
※ Please cut bamboo, bamboo grass, and reed binds to a length 80 cm or less.

Metal item

Mattress (with spring), bicycles, steel products, metal screens, long metal pieces, metallic doors, irons, sewing machines, electric fans, heaters (fuel drained and batteries removed), video decks, CD players, air purifiers.
※ For edged tools, please wrap newspaper around the blade, etc. Before discarding.
※ Please remove batteries (including rechargeable battery) where possible.

Plastic item

Hoses, helmets, clocks, lighting fixtures, styrofoam (pieces that do not fit inside designated bags), polyethylene tanks (emptied of contents), composite products made mainly of plastics.
※ If the garbage comprised only of plastics and can fit in a designated garbage bag, place in a burnable garbage.
※ Please remove batteries (including rechargeable battery) where possible.

Bedding / rugs (Tie the top tightly with strong string)

Carpet, Mattresses (without springs), blanket, curtain, electric carpet, cloths/clothing.
※ Dispose clothes in a bag that allows the contents to be seen. They are reused and recycled, so please dispose of items with your name on them or items that are dirty as burnable garbage.

China and porcelain (ceramics)/glasses other than empty bottles used to contain beverages and foods (in a sturdy bag)

Mirrors, flowerpots, sand for pets, teacups, horticulture earth and sand, heat-resistant glass, sheet glass, Clothes drying platforms, cosmetic bottles, glass tumblers.
※ Contact Recycle Section for household articles containing asbestos. (☎221-2404)

Empty bottles (The contents need to be washed and emptied. Remove the cap and cover. Do not put it in a plastic bag when throwing it away.)

Transparent Brown Other
※ Glass bottles that contained materials other than drink or food, are made of heat resistant glass (glass pots and covers) and glass cosmetics bottles must be categorized as ceramics for garbage disposal.

Plastic bottles (Wash, remove covers and labels, crush.)

Recycled into PET bottles.
PET
"Identification Display Mark" "Material Indication Mark"
※ Take off covers and labels, and throw them out as plastic container packages.

Paper cartons (washed, open and dried)

Paper packages of 500ml or bigger
※ Throw paper package of less than 500ml in size as a "mixed paper".
※ When the inside of a package is brown or laminated with aluminum foil, treat it as burnable garbage.

Empty cans (Contents must be emptied. Remove the caps and covers. Do not put them in plastic bags when throwing them away)

Empty cans less than 20 liters in size
※ Spray cans and gas cylinders for home cooking can cause explosions and/or fire. Make sure you use up the contents and punch a hole in each can before throwing them away.(see the back as well.)

Fluorescent tubes (Put these items in bins for fluorescent tubes without breaking them.)

Fluorescent tubes, incandescent light bulbs, LED bulbs, and similar items
※ Dispose of these items without putting them in boxes, ※ If any of these items are broken, put them in transparent bags.

Batteries and similar items (Put these items in battery recycling bins without breaking them.)

Batteries, Lithium primary batteries, clinical mercury thermometers, mercury thermometers, mercury manometers, and similar items
※ Please insulate coin cell lithium batteries (with model numbers CR or BR) with cellophane tape, etc. Before discarding.
※ However, small rechargeable batteries / button cell batteries are to be disposed of at stores.
※ If any of these items are broken, put them in transparent bags.

Used paper (Newspaper, cardboard and magazines should each be securely tied up in bundles with string)

●Items the city does not collect (These cannot be put out at garbage collection spot.)

TVs, refrigerators and freezers (including wine fridges, coolers and chillers), washing machines and clothes dryers, air conditioners (including outdoor units) cannot be disposed of at the bulky waste station or brought to Eco Park Aboshi. Please have them picked up by your nearest retail store. (see the back as well.)	Ask the manufacturer or a delivery service to collect the home computer and display. (See the back as well.)	These items should be returned to the shop or store where the item was purchased. Waste oil Batteries Scuba bottle Gas bottles, scuba bottles, fire extinguishers, tires, batteries, residual paint, kerosene, poisons, tatami mats, safes, pianos, and Motorbikes, syringes, etc.	Massive amounts of waste that are the result of moving, objects 50kg or heavier, and large amounts of wood waste or pruned tree branches cannot be taken to regular garbage disposal sites. Even if each piece weighs 50kg or less, please ensure that the total amount discharged at one time does not exceed 50kg. 1 For information on how to bring in the garbage to Eco Park Aboshi refer to the back side and contact us in advance. (TEL: 272-5540-5551) 2 Or, request a collection business designated by the city to collect these items. According to the law, it is the responsibility of each industry to dispose of their own industrial garbage. 1 Try to recycle/return items back to resources. 2 Dispose of the item by yourself. 3 Ask city approved garbage collection dealers to dispose of the item.
